I wish each Brother a happy holiday season. Be safe as you travel to your different Lodge and personal activities. I will see you in the new year.



I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable Thanksgiving and plenty of time to spend with family and friends. It is a great time of year, not only because it begins what is traditionally our "holiday season," but for us as Freemasons, we do our annual rituals (elections and installations) and prepare ourselves for the excitement of the upcoming Masonic year.

At the SOI on November 25th, we focused on the open installation now required in all Lodges. Hopefully, you were able to get all questions answered and are ready for the installation. Since this is one of the few times non-Masons get to see Masonic ritual, it is important that you make a special effort to have the ritual well-hearsed. Pay attention to the details. Is all the regalia in the right place? Do you know when and where Masonic clothing is

removed? Do you know how to properly present regalia and other documents and tools? Do you know the correct way to turn when escorting a new officer to his station? These are details you need to rehearse to be fully ready for a well-done installation. If you would like to have a principal attend your Lodge rehearsal for election and/or installation of officers, please let one of us know as soon as possible and we will make every effort to have someone attend.

At the December 16th SOI (third Monday and not the fourth Monday), we will do the Business of the Lodge. The intent of this session is for new WMs and officers for the upcoming Masonic year to review BOL and to make sure you are ready for that first Lodge meeting in January. For those new WMs and incoming officers, particularly the WM, SW, JW, Secretary, SD and Pursuivant, please make a special effort to attend this meeting. Incoming officers should review this ritual before SOI to make sure you don't have any questions that we could answer in this session. We will pay particular attention to receiving and voting on petitions and the reception of the DDGM. Again, our hope is that this session will get all new officers off to a great start for next year. For current and repeating WMs, if you can attend, you can share your experience and some of the things that helped you be successful in the East. For those of you who would like to get your calendar for next year updated early, the Region 2 Sectional School is on Saturday, Mar 22, 2025, at the York Masonic Center. District 3 will exemplify BOL. Currently I have no information on the Spring visit to District Three by our Regional Instructor for Region Two, Brother Paul A. Sutcliffe, Jr. Hopefully we will have this information by SOI on Monday, December 16th.

A Series In Masonic Education

The History of The Masonic Lite Podcast



After attending a meeting of the Pennsylvania Academy of Masonic Knowledge in 2015, two Lancaster Co. Masons, Pete Ruggeri and Larry Merris conceived the surreal notion of creating a podcast and dedicating to their fellow masons, to talk about their experiences in Freemasonry. Sure, there were other masonic podcasts, but they were very cerebral not at all what these two had in mind. Their idea was to create an unstuffy, conversational, and humorous approach to the craft. Their hope was to get 10-15 people to listen to their ridiculous ramblings.

In the 8th year of the reign of Obama, on the 6th day of the Julian calendar April, the Masonic Lite Podcast was born! In a recording studio

in Lancaster, where a producer named Mason (who was not a mason!) handled the tech stuff, what would become the 2nd most listened to masonic podcast began! It was funded out of the pockets of Pete and Larry!

The early episodes were mostly a 'what's been happening in Freemasonry in general, and Lancaster Co. in particular.' On episode 8, Jack Harley, a PM from Ephrata Lodge No. 665 was a guest, and by episode 20, Jack had become a regular co-host. Topics began to broaden to include a discussion of the effectiveness of '1-day Classes,' the newly established Almoners Fund by the Grand Lodge, and the podcast's first international guest, when a brother from Australia, who had his own podcast, was a guest. If the 1-Day class and Almoners Fund discussion wasn't enough to grab the attention of the Grand Lodge, when the discussion of the title of a West Wing TV series episode, which happened to be a masonic 'word' aired, the suspicion was full blown and led to the now infamous "Lost Episode!"

There's a saying that there is no such thing as 'bad press' and the same can be said for MLP. The frank discussion and breadth of topics only led to more listenership. This growth of listenership only grew further when guests such as the Supreme Grand Commander of the Scottish Rite, NMJ, and other masonic dignitaries from around the country began to appear as guests.

By 2017, the recording sessions had moved to Pete's basement (aka Monarch Studios), where Pete's dobermans were constantly plotting on how best to eat Jack alive! By 2018, several listeners had pitched in to build a studio in the basement of Ephrata Lodge No. 665 where the permanent home of MLP lives today, deep beneath the Wine and Spirits store! Near the end of 2018, a truly momentous interview occurred when then Grand Master S. Eugene Herritt came on the show as a guest! The guys all put their dues cards on the table at the beginning of the show figuring that if they were still there by the end of the show, then they did ok!

2019 began with the introduction of a new co-host and a new producer! Needing a producer replacement, Josh "Lamberton" was brought in beginning on episode 67. On the same episode, Tim Dedman, PM of Eureka-West Shore Lodge No. 302 in Mechanicsburg became the first non-Lancaster Co co-host. The show continued to grow in listenership. When frequently asked, Larry reports that the show is listened to by 2 million listeners in 14 countries, and on 3 planets! On a serious note, at one point, the show was actually the #1 comedy podcast in Bulgaria!

2020 was the COVID year, and also led to the development and broadcast of MLP's Digital Order of the Knights Quarantine, a special production developed to raise money for the National Meals on Wheels (we had hoped for a masonic charity, but that's a much longer story!). We hoped to get 30-40 people to send us \$30 for the charity and to tune into a Zoom call to view. The production and subsequent jewels helped us to raise over \$10,000!



With lodges closed for most of the year due to the pandemic, MLP became the go-to place for masonic education! We've had 100s of brethren report that they depended in MLP for their masonic education during COVID. In addition to continue to produce about 2 shows monthly, the team members are regularly asked to present lodge programs on the podcast, where even more masons learn about the podcast.

In all, we've had 3 sitting Grand Masters (and 1 past Grand Master), 1 Sovereign Grand Master, 1 Grand High Priest, several other deputies and officers, and dozens of dues paying masons who've lived interesting lives as guests! The show that's best described as 5 friends sitting around a table discussing Freemasonry continues to grow. In early 2023, our founder, friend, and brother Pete Ruggeri passed away, but the show continues his vision of having a show that presents the 'lighter side' of Freemasonry. Sometime in mid-2024, we will record our 200th episode, all of which can be listened to on your favorite podcast app, or by going to https://masoniclite.podcastpage.io



December 16 7 PM


